## **Programs & Guided Activities**

#### Junior MAER (45 min)

For children age 6 - 12; \$10/\$5 (CCS members) per child, reservations recommended. Kids will learn about the tools used by our Marine Animal Entanglement Response (MAER) team to free a whale or sea turtle trapped in fishing lines and gear; see videos, photos, and tools from actual disentanglement operations; and try their hand at "rescuing" a "whale." Meet at SEA Space in Whaler's Wharf. Space is limited.



**Get to the Bottom of It** (1–1.5 hrs) For children ages 6 - 12; \$10/\$5 (CCS members) per child, reservations recommended. Join us at the beach and become a junior marine biologist! Use a special net to collect samples from the shallow waters, then use a microscope to take an up-close look at the tiny marine animals that live in the harbor. Meet at SEA Space in Whaler's Wharf. Space is limited.

#### Guided Seal Walks (1.5 hrs)

All ages welcome; \$10 donation per person, reservations required, space limited. Gray seals and harbor seals can often be seen resting on local beaches at areas called "haul-outs." Join CCS educators for a hike to search for seals in Truro and learn more about the role these animals play in our coastal ecosystem. Register online, drop in to SEA Space at Whaler's Wharf, or contact Jesse Mechling at 508-487-3622, x114. All walks begin at High Head in Truro in the parking lot off High Head Road.

#### Learn at the Beach

Visit the Center's new pop-up education and information stations on several Outer Cape beaches. Discover more about seals, sharks, and other marine animals that visit Cape Cod waters!
